MAY DEMONSTRATION with JENNY CROOM

Jenny Croom painted a Russian friend, and used range of brushes but took to scraper, cloth, and stubby brush for energetic effects. Jenny starts her portraits with darkest tones. When working from her tablet/photo, she has that in her left hand with multiple brushes, and proceeds to paint using her right hand. Colours that were popular for Jenny were naples yellow green, venetian red, yellow ochre and a violet to cool down skin tones. Darker tones are often warmer. Jenny suggests being forgiving in the early stages. The face appears through just a few strokes with different tonal values. By lining up the inside of the nose with the eye correct dimensions appear. Venetian red was used for the mouth but with up and down strokes. The up and down strokes were quite popular for Jenny to use with great effect. A small brush for some small details for placement of location of shapes was used. Quite a few "patches" of paint formed the layers required to reveal skin colouring. Antique White was used as it is a warm white. For the background Jenny used a very large palette knife, swiping the paint across the canvas covering the portrait outline a little. A catalyst was also used to move the paint. By the end of the demo we could all see a beautiful face and thoroughly enjoyed the experience.


MAY **ARTIST OF** THE MONTH

Jenny showed her 'rustic' palette, saying "it was cheap plastic serving tray, covered with a barely damp layer of old towel though any cloth would do. Some like to use paper towel. The damp layer I cover with baking paper, which stays strong. When the paper is too messy and horrible I let it dry and use the other side. I have a second plastic tray to cover the first, upside down, so paint can stay good for days if carefully done. Not my original idea but forgotten where I first heard of it years ago. "

JUNE DEMONSTRATION with CATHERINE LAWLOR

It was a full house at the Studio for Catherine Lawlor's demonstration. Catherine gave an energetic and informative demo and an insight into her art practice which includes meditation and music. She had chosen a colour



palette for her abstract painting using acrylic house paint colour chips and had sample pots of each colour

(from Bunnings) plus regular artists acrylic paints, inks, polyfilla (for adding texture), oil pastels and Posca pens. With her canvas flat and using a black oil pastel Catherine started her painting with marks, working intuitively, then applied layers of paint over the top. She rubbed back the paint to expose the marks underneath. Catherine loves mixed media and loves to have fun with her painting, pushing and pulling the paint around the canvas, rubbing away paint in areas and letting it build up in others. She used a spray bottle of water to make the paint runny on the canvas and moved the paint and ink by tilting the canvas creating runs and drips and other interesting effects and textures.

MAXINE WADE FIGURES IN GOUACHE SATURDAY 6 JULY - 1.30pm - 3.30pm



Maxine Wade has always had an interest in creativity and trained as an Art teacher at Melbourne University, going on to teach in a variety of secondary colleges for 27 years. After operating a picture framing business, she now tutors adults in watercolour, drawing and life drawing at

several art societies in Melbourne. She has held many solo and joint exhibitions over 35 years and is currently tutoring in watercolour at Victorian Artists' Society, Brighton Art Society, Glen Eira Cheltenham Art Group and Malvern Artists' Society and life drawing at McClelland Guild of Artists.



"My first love will always be watercolour, and I have been influenced by many great artists in this medium. Its beauty and fluidity, with all its surprises - never fail to delight me - though it is a medium full of challenges. I work in a wide range of subjects including figures, boats, landscapes, still life, portraits, street scenes, interiors and animals. Most recently I have been combining other media with watercolour... inks, gouache and charcoal to explore further textural effects." MW

AUGUST DEMONSTRATION

CLIVE SINCLAIR LANDSCAPE IN WATERCOLOUR SATURDAY 3 AUGUST 1.30pm - 3.30pm

Clive Sinclair became interested in art and studied under John Lennox in 1973. He travelled extensively throughout Europe and in 1975 studied art in



London where he developed a love of the impressionists. On his return to Australia he developed a deep interest in small, delicate watercolours inspired by Hilder, Sturgess and Clarice Beckett. The evening light which they captured in their paintings and the poetic beauty of their vision influenced Clive in his own work. Clive is an Elected Fellow of the Victorian Artists Society Melbourne, a member of the Watercolour Society of Victoria, exhibiting member of The Twenty Melbourne Painters Society and the Australian Guild of Realist Artists. Clive teaches art throughout Melbourne and Victoria including at the Victorian Art Society, Peninsula Art Society, Hampton Community Centre, and currently teaches at the bayside suburbs of Beaumaris, Brighton Art Society and Mentone Art Group as well as workshops Interstate and Overseas. Clive has won numerous awards over the years including Victorian Artists Society, "Victorian Artist of the year 2011"

"I paint for the pure impression of capturing the light and simplicity finding joy in the wet on wet washes creating subtle impressions on the paper, movement and harmony offering me the excitement of each stroke with every mark upon the paper, often making it towards abstraction. The love of simplicity is what art and painting is for me as an artist." CS


